
Lesson-10: Battle at Mt Gilboa and raid at Ziklag

Lesson 10-Battle at Mt Gilboa and raid at Ziklag

- (1) Background: The Philistines army and Saul's army gathered at Jezreel, near Mt Gilboa for battle.
- (2) David and his men were together with Achish and the Philistines army.

- (3) The Philistines commanders were distrustful of David:
 - (a) During the battle, David may turn against the Philistines.
 - (b) By turning against the Philistines, David will regain the trust of Saul. (1 Sam 29:4-5)
- (4) Due to the commanders' distrust of David, Achish sent David and his men away.
- (5) David responded that he would fight against Saul and his army.
- (1 Sam 29:8)

(6) Spiritual Lessons:

(a)Commentaries do not support David in his response to Achish that he would fight against Saul and his army. Commentators were of the view that David was false and deceitful in his response to Achish.

David had to give the impression that he was loyal to Achish as he was in Philistines territory and under their watchful eye. He had to lie to protect himself and his men.

(a)Do we lie to protect ourselves?

(c) Consider Peter's denial of Jesus, Matt.26:69-75



(d) It may be difficult. But, we should not lie or deny our faith in Christ.


- (e) Do we lie to protect others?
- (f) Consider Rahab and the spies, Joshua 2:4-6.
- (g) It is not easy to answer properly as there is fear of injury to ourself or others. Consider alternatives:
- no answer
- talk about other matters

- (7) The Amalekites have raided Ziklag and captured the Israelite families. (1 Sam 30:3)
- (8) The men were talking of stoning David (1 Sam 30:6) probably for not protecting the families when they were marching with the Philistines at Mt Gilboa.
- (9) David was very <u>fearful and distressed</u> and found strength in the Lord. (1 Sam 30:6).
- (10) David enquired of the Lord whether to pursue and rescue the Israelite families. The Lord replied favourably. (1 Sam 30:7-8)
- (11) David succeeded in rescuing the Israelite families.



(12) Meanwhile, the battle between Saul's army and the Philistines was raging at Mt Gilboa.

(13) Saul and his sons, Jonathan, Abinadab, and Malkishua were killed. (1 Sam 31:2)



(14) Spiritual Lessons:

(a)When we are <u>fearful and</u> <u>distressed</u>, how do we find deliverance from the Lord?

(b) Psalm 34: 17-20
