

- (1) Background: David defeated Goliath and the Philistines.


(1) David won many other battles for Saul. Saul gave him a high rank in the army.





### Jonathan and David promise friendship

1 Samuel 18:1-20:42




(3) After David killed Goliath he returned as a hero and King Saul became very angry and jealous of him.


(1 Sam 18:7-9)



(4) The next day as David was playing the lyre, Saul had a spear in his hand. He hurled it saying, 'I'll pin him to the wall.' But David eluded him twice. 1 Sam 18:10-11



(5) Saul made David commander over a thousand men. The Lord was with David and he was victorious in battles making him even more popular. 1 Sam 18:12-16



(6) Now Saul's daughter Michal was in love with David, and when they told Saul about it, he was pleased.


(1 Sam 18:20-21)



- (7) Saul offered his daughter Michal in marriage to David if he killed 100 Philistines.
- (8) David did not think himself worthy to become the King's sonin-law but took up the challenge.
- (9) David was not killed by the Philistines as Saul hoped but returned in triumph and took Michal as his wife.
- (10) Saul became afraid of David as he knew the Lord was with him. (1 Sam 18: 24-30)

### (11) Spiritual Lessons

(a) David won praises and Saul was jealous



 Definition of Jealousy: "feeling resentment against someone because of that person's rivalry, success, or advantages" (Source: biblestudytools.com)

#### What does the Bible say about jealousy?

- 1 Cor 3:3: "there is among you envying, and strife, and divisions, are ye not carnal, and walk as men?"
- James 3:14-16: "But if ye have <u>bitter envying</u> and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth. This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is <u>earthly</u>, <u>sensual</u>, <u>devilish</u>. For where <u>envying</u> and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work."
- Prov 14:30: "envy the rottenness of the bones."

- (b) Who is your jealous "Saul"?
  - (i) Boss
  - (ii) Colleagues and staff
  - (iii) Relative, friends and acquaintance
  - (iv) Etc...
- (c) How to deal with the jealousy of your "Saul"?
  - (i) Give God the glory and do not exalt yourself.
  - Continue to walk close to God and do His will.
  - God's will continue working at the work place.
    - → leave employment.
  - (ii) Seek wisdom from God.
  - Always give credit to your boss for the support and guidance.
  - Success is due to colleagues' co-operation.
  - Success is due to staff who worked hard.

- (d) Are we jealous of others?
  - (i) We are jealous of another person for:
    - (1) his/her big house/car,
    - (2) en-bloc sale,
    - (3) his/her children's academic results,
    - (4) career achievements and salary, or
    - (5) well respected service in church.
    - (6) etc...
  - (ii) We resent the achievement of another person and feel that we deserve that achievement more.
  - (iii) We are unable to be happy for the good things enjoyed by another person because of our jealousy and discontentment.

- (e) How do we overcome our jealousy?
  - (i) Pray to God for forgiveness of our jealousy.
  - (ii) Apply "To rejoice with those who rejoice" (Romans 12:15)
  - (iii) Count our blessings and be content. "Godliness with contentment is great gain" (1 Timothy 6:6)
