

(1) Background: The Philistines set up their camp at Shunem. Saul and his army set up their camp at Gilboa. David was taking refuge in Philistine country.


(2) Saul was terrified at the Philistine army.





King Saul's last days


1 Samuel 28:31, 2 Samuel 1:1-2:7




Samuel the prophet died in his old age and was buried in his home town of Ramah. Some time afterwards, the **Philistines** again made war on Israel.



The Philistines brought their army to a place near Shunem.



King Saul and his army went out to defend their country. They camped on Mount Gilboa but when Saul saw the Philistine army, he was afraid.




Saul tried to find out what the Lord wanted him to do but the Lord gave no answer. So Saul foolishly decided to do something that God had strictly forbidden - visit a medium (a person who claims to be able to speak to the spirits of the dead). 1 Sam 28:6-7




Now King Saul has already outlawed all mediums from the land of Israel. But his servant knew that there was a woman living in Endor who was a medium. 1 Sam 28:7



King Saul put on a disguise and went to see her.



Saul said to her, 'Speak to the spirits and call up the one I tell you.' But the woman, a witch, was suspicious, fearing it was a trap. 'Surely you know that the King has forbidden anyone to do that,' she said.



Saul promised her she would be safe. Then he asked her to call back the spirit of the prophet Samuel. When Saul heard Samuel's voice he said, 'I am in great trouble, Samuel. Tell me what I must do.' 1 Sam 28:15



Samuel replied, 'As you have disobeyed The Lord, He is giving your kingdom to David. The Philistines will defeat you and tomorrow you and your sons will be with me.' Saul was terrified. 1 Sam 28:18-20

Matthew Poole's commentary on 1 Samuel 28:14-

"Saul perceived that it was Samuel;"

- (a) the woman pretended, and Saul upon her suggestion believed, that it was Samuel indeed; and so many popish and some other writers conceived. But that it was not Samuel, but the devil representing Samuel, is sufficiently evident.
- (b) For, first, It is most incredible that God, who had just now refused to answer Saul by the means which himself appointed and used in that case, would answer him, or suffer Samuel to answer him, in that way, and upon the use of those means which God detested and contemned; etc...

(3) Spiritual Lessons

(a) As Christians, we must never consult mediums:

"Regard not those with familiar spirits, neither seek after wizards to be defiled by them: I am the Lord your God." Leviticus 19:31

Also: Leviticus 20:6, Leviticus 20:27

(b) Do not consult:

(i) Fortune tellers

(ii) Horoscope

(iii) Almanac

(iv) Feng-sui

(v) Lucky charm, wishing well, etc.

(vi) seance and occult practice
